



## Return to School

Questions	Response
<p>Will timings still be staggered?</p>	<p>Yes timings will be staggered to limit the number of people accessing the school at one time. After reviewing our previous timings we found that most parents were dropping children at a particular time. Therefore we have changed our timings to reflect this:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Children with siblings at school start time: 8.45am</b>  <b>Children with siblings at school collection time: 3.10pm</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Children without siblings at school start time: 8.55am</b>  <b>Children without siblings at school collection time: 3.15pm</b></p>
<p>Will the children enter the school through different doors?</p>	<p>Yes, the entry methods will be remaining the same.  Reception and KS1 will enter school through the playground entrance.  KS2 children will enter through the main school door.</p>
<p>Will parents still be required to wear a mask when dropping off and collecting their children?</p>	<p>Yes, it remains good practice for face coverings to be worn, and helps to act as a visual reminder to adults to not congregate whilst COVID 19 restrictions are still in place.</p>
<p>Will playtimes and dinnertimes be staggered?</p>	<p>Yes, we will be keeping our dinnertimes and breaktimes staggered with separate Key Stage bubbles. This enables us to avoid having to close the whole school in the event of a child testing positive for COVID 19 as we are able to isolate close contacts with greater confidence when children have been kept in these bubbles.</p>
<p>Will my child have to take a COVID 19 test?</p>	<p>Families of all school age children are eligible for Lateral Flow Testing (rapid result) if they have NO symptoms of COVID 19, it is not a requirement that anyone takes a Lateral Flow Test before attending school, however there is scientific evidence that asymptomatic testing can help to reduce the spread of COVID 19.</p> <p>If your child has any of the 'main' COVID 19 symptoms, we will recommend that your child is tested. If your child has COVID 19 symptoms and they are not tested for COVID 19 we will ask you to isolate your child at home for the required isolation period.</p>
<p>Will there be 'Catch up' lessons?</p>	<p>All our assessment is aimed at identifying gaps in children's knowledge and understanding and planning lessons which address and close these gaps. Some children will have additional interventions within the school day with school based staff, however this will be part of a holistic approach to respond and recover from the impact of COVID 19.</p>
